Luncheon Speaker is State Rep. Barbara Marumoto

Barbara's Republican biography started in the 60s when she started voting. Back then she volunteered on the campaigns of Rep. Buddy (Everybody Needs A Buddy) Soares and Sen. Fred Rohlfling.

Barbara became a session staffer in Rohlfling's office in 1972 and that's when she started attending state Republican Party conventions and joined the Oahu League of Republican Women. She served as

president of the OLRW in the '90s. She helped on Fred's two congressional races in '74 and '76. She did one session stint in Rep. John Carroll's office in '77 before Pat Saiki hired her into the Senate Minority Research Office.

In 1978 she was elected as a Delegate to the Constitutional Convention. Later that year she ran for the House and has represented the area around Kahala Mall for the past 31 years. Barbara was the Minority Leader in the '80s and the '90s.

In 1994 she attended her first national Republican convention and hasn't missed one yet. She was honored to serve as the Hawaii Chair of the Bush for President campaign.

In the Legislature Barbara has distinguished herself by helping small business causes, keeping kids out of pickup truck beds, educational efforts to prevent cervical cancer, securing a \$25 tax credit for purchase of a keiki car seat and requiring DNA collection from convicted felons.

Barbara would like to continue fighting for the Republican cause and does not want to quit until the GOP has the majority in the state House!

This was the correct decision from the standpoint of Hawaii State law.

Mr Abercrombie was trying to bypass the law to make it easier for him to get an immediate infusion of cash into his governor's campaign.

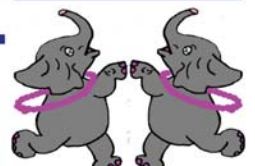

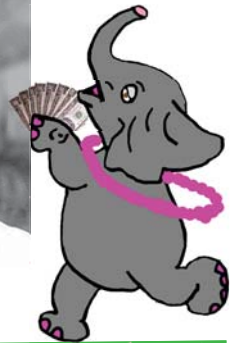

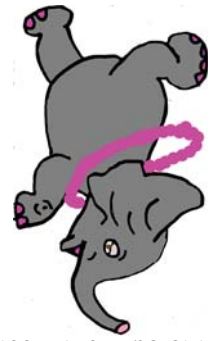


THE BASIC RULES FOR CLOTHESLINES (I can hear my mother now.)

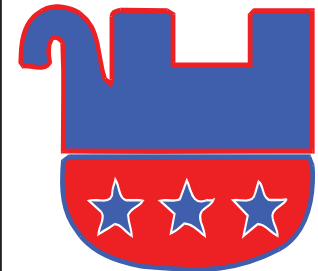

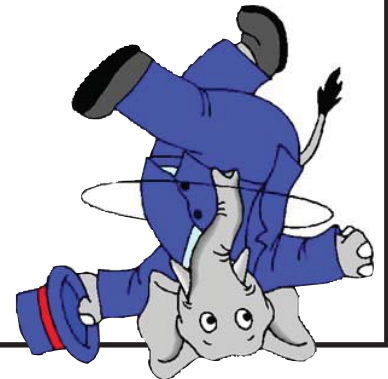
