Last Month's Luncheon-

Senator Fred Hemmings was our keynote speaker in November and spoke about wasteful spending in education with no fiscal accountability. He emphasized that it is not the teachers who are to blame. They are dedicated and proficient. The system needs to be fixed and eliminating DOE's huge bureaucracy needs to be the focus. He has called for an audit every legislative year with no success.

He addressed the monopoly of Hawaiian Electric Industries, the holding company of our major electric companies on most islands, and its failure to keep up with transmission infrastructure by stalling to initiate underground and safe utility lines; our over-dependence on fossil fuels while ignoring so many alternative energy capabilities and its business ventures that were bad investments.

Senator Hemmings also spoke about our rusted stadium property and a plan to build a new state of the art sports facility with a shopping complex, a hotel/condominium, rail depot, and a multi-tiered parking structure. This public-private partnership in economically challenging times might be the answer because the State Legislature will have a difficult time appropriating CIP funding in this down economy.

Unfortunately for the people of Hawaii, Senator Hemmings intends to retire in 2010. We will lose an outstanding advocate and leader who has served us well for over 20 years. We thanked him for his dedication and wished him well.

Mr. John Carroll, 2010 gubernatorial candidate addressed our membership. He explained that he is running because the state's high cost of living is a major concern of his and he would like to see a repeal of the Jones Act as one of the solutions and has filed a lawsuit to repeal the Act.

Thanks to Helen Kekuna for the wonder<mark>ful ta</mark>ble decorations. We sold them after the luncheon and the proceeds went to our PAC.




