Councilmember Charles K. Djou currently represents the Fourth Council District (Waikiki to Hawaii Kai). In the City Council, Charles serves as the Chairman of the Executive Matters and Legal Affairs Committee; Vice-Chairman of the Planning Committee; and is a member of the Public Infrastructure, Public Safety and Services, and Transportation Committees.

Previously, Charles served as a State Representative in the Hawaii State House, where he was the Minority Floor Leader.

Raised on Oahu, Charles spent most of his life in Hawaii. Charles graduated from Punahou School and earned both a B.A. in Political Science and a B.S. in Economics from the University of Pennsylvania, Wharton School of Finance and Commerce, graduating magna cum laude with distinction. Charles earned his law degree from the University of Southern California law school. Outside of the City Council, Charles serves as a Captain in the United States Army Reserve. He also teaches as an adjunct professor at the University of Hawaii West Oahu campus.

Charles is an active member of the community. He is currently a member of the Oahu Advisory Council of the American Lung Association of Hawaii and a former Honolulu neighborhood board member. Charles is also a member of the Young Business Roundtable, the Chinese Jaycees, and the Hawaii Telecommunications Association. Charles is a member of the Hawaii Republican Party, where he previously served as Vice -Chair.

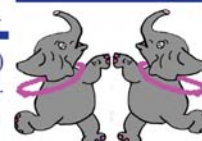

History of Oahu League of Republican Women

The Oahu League of Republican Women was founded in 1946 by Mrs. Elizabeth Farrington, wife of the Territory of Hawaii's congressional delegate. Mrs. Farrington was, at that time, president of the Washington League of Republican Women. Ten women on Oahu joined to form the Oahu League, and obtained the charter. The following year when clubs had been formed on the island of Hawaii, Maui, Kauai and Molokai, the Oahu league joined with them to become affiliated as a state federation. Mrs Farrington became the first president of Oahu League, also an honorary president for life. We have had 24 presidents since 1946.

Early accomplishments of the Oahu league were a successful series of "schools of politics". Commencement exercises with diplomas were given and signed by the republican national committee. This school was for anyone running for precinct president or district chairman, public or party office. In spite of the Oahu League's efforts and good intentions, Republican Party officials sometimes resented them. Mostly men, they didn't want another republican organization infringing on their territory. Agreement was finally reached: the women would continue with coffee hours and help with transportation on Election Day. We could also do registration at the Conventions.

In 1974 a resolution prepared by then senator Fred Roling authorized the study of means by which the Republican Party of Hawaii could acquire a permanent headquarters. It was passed. But by 1976 even the concept itself was abandoned by both the Republican Party and the Oahu League.

Martha Daniels, who joined Oahu league in 1954, became a life Member in 1974. Martha Daniels set up a trust for a home for the Oahu League. It seems she tired of waiting for the party to do it. It was always her dream to have a permanent home for the Oahu League. In her trust she stated that it was for a building only, so the League needed a partner. She gave Oahu League 10 years to find a home after her passing in March 1989 at the age of 99 years.

In March 1999, the Republican Party, chaired by Donna Alcantara, and Oahu League, presided over by Helen Kekuna, worked together to purchase the headquarters for both organizations. Finally we were back together. The hopes and dreams of many finally came true. 24 years after Fred Roling started the idea, we have the Martha Daniels' Oahu League of Republican Women and Hawaii Republican Party together in one place. Our home.

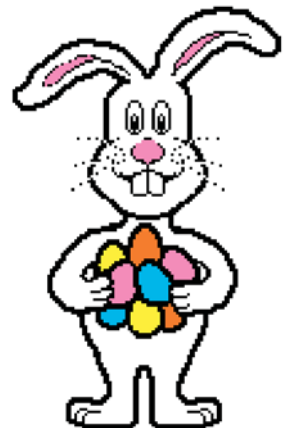

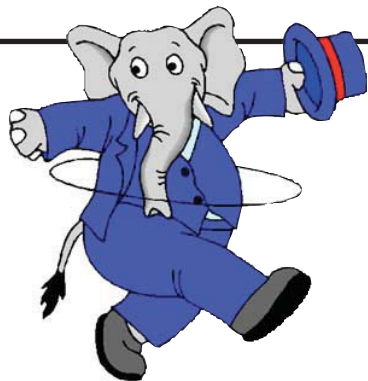

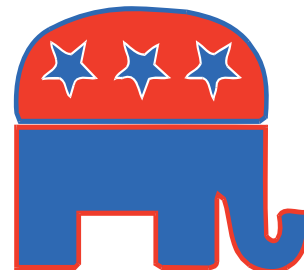
