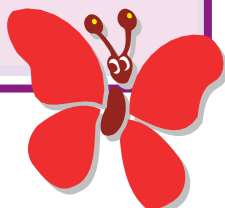

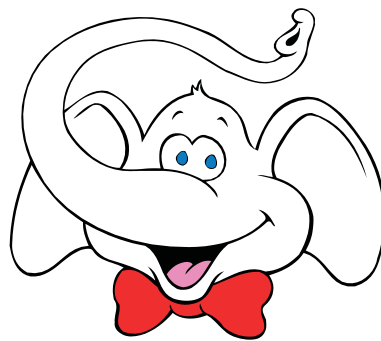
Guest Speaker

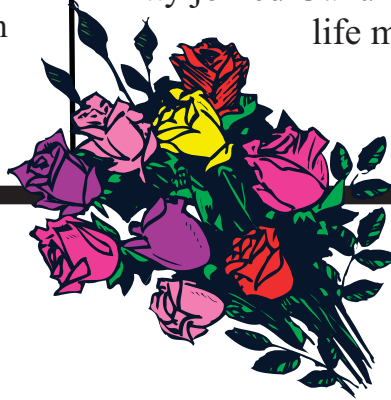

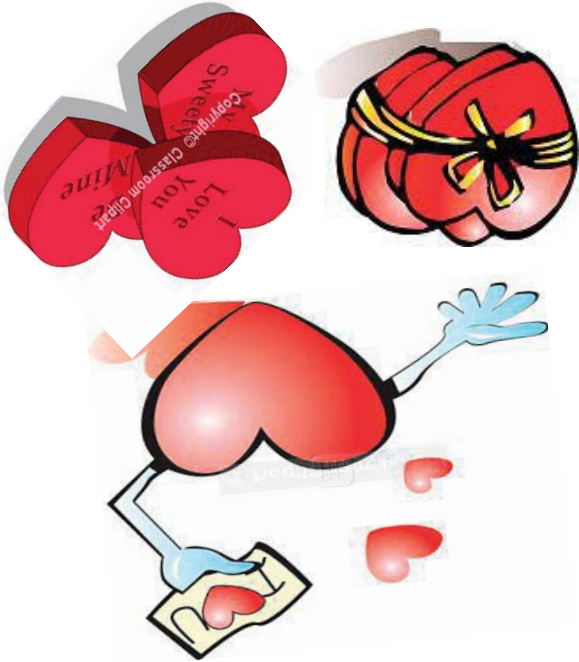
