Guest Speaker Lowell Kalapa

President of Tax Foundation of Hawaii

“Taxes in Hawaii”



Among the many educational activities undertaken by Mr. Kalapa, he has assisted numerous nonprofit organizations in understanding the roles and responsibilities of board members of those organizations and where the line begins and ends insofar as oversight and governance of those organizations. Unlike corporate boards, members of nonprofit organizations must remember that they are not responsible to stockholders/investors, but to the community at large. Often volunteers on nonprofit governing boards misunderstand their roles and lack the broader picture of what they are accountable for and to whom they remain accountable.

An advocate of community building, Mr. Kalapa has provided leadership and guidance to numerous community groups and nonprofit organizations in the area of board governance, fiduciary responsibility, and strategic planning. Of particular interest to Mr. Kalapa have been the challenges that face the Hawaiian community and he has facilitated board training and strategic planning for agencies such as Queen Lili'uokalani Children's Center, the Native Hawaiian Educational Council, Papa Ola Lokahi, and the Board of Trustees of Kawaiaha'o Church. He has given guidance to many of the member agencies of Aloha United Way as part of the Community Building Evaluation Committee and in his advisory capacity on the Steering Committee of the Weed & Seed Initiative.

The Tax Foundation is a private, nonprofit, non-partisan, educational organization established to research issues confronting governments in the area of public finance, taxation, and public administration. Although the Foundation is often mistaken for a state or county agency, it is supported entirely by private contributions.

The Star Advertiser's front page quoted our President "We have cleared away the rubble of crisis, and we can say with renewed confidence that the state of our union is strong." REALLY!

Did he discuss plans on job creation to offset unemployment, the economy, a balanced budget, or our \$16.5 trillion debt that is growing by the hour?

Our President is now pushing for universal pre-kindergarten education and \$9 minimum wage. As noble as this sounds, who will pay for this? Will his push for higher taxes on wealthy Americans and fewer tax breaks for corporations offset these programs?

WHY does the President board a plane one day later to campaign his ideas to states instead of walking the corridors of Congress to meet with the Congress that we, the people, elected?



Pearl Harbor employees have already been alerted that one-day a month furloughs may begin in March. This impacts middle income, not the highly paid.

In conclusion, our President is an eloquent speaker, "long on rhetoric, short on constructive ideas" as quoted by Rep. Joe Barton from Texas. He touched your heart by elaborating on gun violence and recognized victims of such violence in the audience, mentioned our broken immigration system, and championed for pre-kindergarten education. He talks a good talk.

I don't see any hope for bipartisanship on Capitol Hill. Do you? Down at our State Capitol, the insanity continues: proposed higher General Excise, Conveyance, Transient Accommodation, Liquor, Tobacco, "sugary beverage" and other taxes; a Bill to make it illegal to smoke in your private condo but another Bill to legalize marijuana for recreation use. DUH?

Want to get married? The Health Department wants to raise the Hawaii license fee from the current \$60 to \$100. Hang on to your nickels and dimes...Abercrombie is out to grab them!

Remembering Martha

Martha Daniels, who joined Oahu League in 1954, became a Life Member in 1974. It was always her dream to have a permanent home for the Oahu League. In her trust she stated that it was for a building only so the League needed a partner. She gave Oahu League 10 years to find a home after her passing in March 1989 at the age of 99 years. In 1999, ten years after her passing, her generous gift to the Oahu League of Republican Women became a reality with our partnership with the Hawaii Republican Party and the purchase of our home at 725 Kapiolani Boulevard.

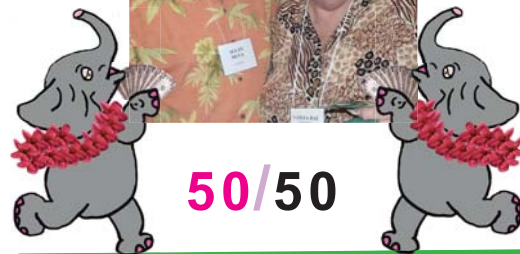
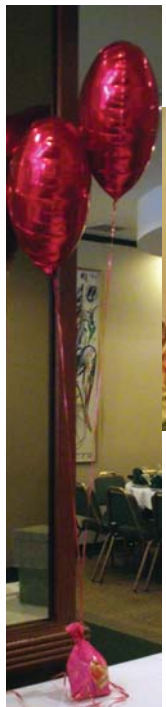

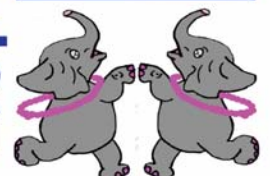

Girl's Day

3/3 or March 3rd is Hinamatsuri or Girl's Day in Japan. It's also referred to as Momo no Sekku or Peach Festivities. Sekku, was an occasion borrowed from China to signify the change of seasons. Girls' Day celebrates and prays for a young girl's growth and happiness. Coming from a family of five girls, I think it's a wonderful tradition to have a special day for girls, regardless of what nationality you are!

Why do they use the peach to symbolize this day? March is when the peach flower blooms and the pink flowers are perfect for the young girls. It is a tradition that the maternal grandparents give Japanese dolls called Hina ningyo to the baby girl. These dolls are dressed in elaborate kimonos and accessories, as you can see from the photo above. Today, there are such a variety of dolls from the very simple to elaborate.

The above photo shows a most elaborate 7 tier version. At the top is the Emperor, odairi sama, and Empress, ohina sama. The second tier has three court ladies, san-nin kanjo, the third include five court musicians, go nin bayashi, the fourth tier has two ministers on either side, called daijin sama and the fifth has three jicho or deputy chiefs. The last two tiers have various lacquered traditional items and accessories that would be used by the imperial court.

These full sets of Hina dolls can cost thousands of dollars and are often passed down through generations. If one decides to begin this tradition in their home, they often buy the emperor and empress first and every year will add one doll and maybe a few accessories each year. This becomes the new family heirloom.

This is also a fun time for little girls to dress in their kimonos and enjoy Japanese sweets. In Hawaii, since the traditional Japanese foods are not as readily available, they often make sweet mochi, rice cake, what the locals call Chi Chi Dango, using mochiko, which is rice flour, and coconut milk.

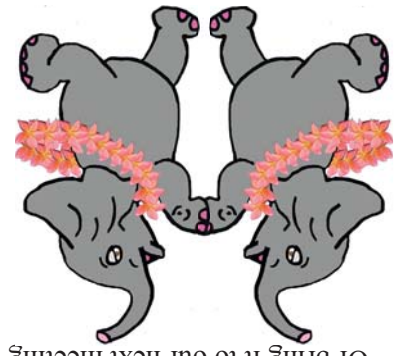

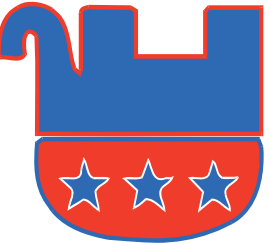
