

- 5. Do consider a pre- or post-marital agreement if you have family wealth you want to protect.
- Do consider establishing generation-skipping trusts for children and grandchildren.
- Do consider owning your life insurance through an irrevocable trust to minimize estate taxes.
- DON'T put your children on title to your accounts or real property.
- 9. DON'T use a Revocable Living Trust for asset protection.
- 10. DON'T name siblings as trustees for one another.







RNC Spring Meeting Report

Your Hawaii RNC Members have just returned from a 4 day meeting of the Republican National Committee in Los Angeles where there were comprehensive workshops on Grassroots Reform, Fund Raising, Data Base Development and Use and Coalition Building. The mantra for our meeting was implementing a year around campaign strategy.

A major feature of the Spring meeting was the unanimous approval of changing rule 16A(2) so that the rules of state parties and the laws of each state will be the final determination on the delegates that states send to the national convention.

We met privately with the new RNC Chief of Staff and Political Director who sought information on the needs of our party. They agreed to send trainers to Hawaii two days prior to our state convention to participate in updated Nuts and Bolts training for the Executive Director, interns. grassroots leaders, candidates and volunteers. We urge everyone to sign up for this free workshop which will occur on Friday, May 17th at HRP HQ in Honolulu. This critical training will include all of the components of campaigning, including FUND-RAISING. Trainers will be former Western Regional Political Directors. To reserve a spot, please contact Nacia at 808 284 3235.

RNC Chairman, Reince Priebus, expressed his complete support of a 50 State and territories strategy. Outstanding moments and speakers were V.P. Dick Cheney who served as our luncheon speaker and spoke about current national policies that endanger national security; Michael Reagan talked of Ronald Reagan's commitment to the 11th commandment "not to speak ill of other Republicans", and radio talk show host, Hugh Hewitt and Former Congressman Alan West provided insight into current domestic policies which threaten our American way of life. Author and political activist, David Horowitz, addressed RNC members at the Reagan Library urging Republicans to "Go for the Heart", making the point that the 2012 elections were driven by emotions, not reason.

At this meeting, Chairman, David Chang, participated in a panel discussion of messaging for minority groups. Chairman Reince Priebus asked me to serve on the National Convention Subcommittee, which is an outgrowth of the "Growth and Opportunity Project" analysis. This committee will examine all aspects of the national convention process and provide recommendations to the 168 members of the RNC.

I look forward to seeing all of your as delegates to the State Convention. If you are not a delegate but would like to attend, please contact the HRP at 593-8180.

I look forward to seeing each of you at the convention and the Nuts and Bolts Workshops.




