three of our Republican members in the State House leadership structure. This show of bipartisanship caused ripples of indignation in the Democratic Party leadership but our Republican House Representatives will hold vice-chairmanships in three key committees: Minority Leader Representative Aaron Ling Johanson will serve as Vice Chair of Finance. Representative Gene Ward will serve as the Vice Chair of Economic Development & Business. Representative Cynthia Thielen will serve as the Vice Chair of Energy & Environmental Protection.

Workers nationwide are noticing that their biweekly paychecks are less because of the payroll tax hike back to 6.2% from 4.2%. This tax funds Social Security and significantly impacts lower income wage earners. These workers will have to be more watchful in their spending while Congress doesn't know the meaning of "cut spending." It's difficult to understand how our President stated that \$40 more/less a paycheck is a small sacrifice when he and his family just spent \$7M+ on a Hawaiian vacation at our expense.

A Democrat will destroy it because he's "offended".






















Aloha!




